Featured Speaker: Ivan Portilla Orchids of Ecuador



We are honored to have **Ivan Portilla** from Ecuagenera Nursery, an Ecuadorian orchid company, as our guest speaker for the May meeting. He will speak on **Cattleya maxima** and the orchids of Ecuador. Note that the meeting format will be different: there will be **no Show and Tell** or business meeting to allow more time for the speaker. Please attend and make this meeting a special occasion.

Our May meeting is the inaugural meeting of the Bob Liddell International Speaker Series. The Bob Liddell International Speaker Series was established with a bequest by Bob Liddell to bring exceptionally qualified international speakers to our meeting. Our meeting format for this meeting will be changed to accommodate more time with the speaker. We will forgo the business and

Show and Tell portions of our meeting to allow for additional time after his presentation to answer questions and to discuss with him the orchids he has brought for sale. We will also be having a **reception** after his presentation; small sandwiches, fruit, dessert, wine and coffee will be served.

Ivan Portilla is the *Vice President, Orchid Shows, and Customer Representative for International Sales* at Ecuagenera Nursery in Ecuador. Located in Cuenca, Ecuador at 8,200 feet above sea level, their growing operation includes one of the largest selections of orchids available - including many cool and warm growing species. Their reserves consist of



two huge tracts of high mountain jungle, one somewhat lower in elevation than the other - offering two distinctly different growing habitats. Their efforts with in situ **orchid conservation** has also blossomed into an eco-tourist business. Ecuagenera's mission is to protect, grow and market Ecuadorian species of orchids and ornamental plants, establishing a sustainable management of the resource under the concept of preservation.



Ivan Portilla was born in 1969 in a small town called Bomboiza at Amazon base in the southern part of Ecuador. He has been growing orchids for about 15 years and is in charge of international orchid shows and propagation at the nursery.

They are horsey plants with lots of flowers on them but they don't last all that long. If you don't have any in your collection, you should get at least two different varieties. They are very rewarding plants to grow: they have an upright growth habit, they are reliable May bloomers, and they demand no special care (treat them like castles).

We had a very nice time at the **Tucson Botanical Gardens** (TBG). The butterfly and frog exhibit was very beautiful and interesting. The greenhouse there is doing a lot better under Massimo's care. We had about 11 members and guests show up for the private tour. Massimo was very cordial and wanted some advice on how to do things better. I think we should start a **regular plant box** for the



TBG with some of the things we either don't want any more or can spare divisions. They seem to do very well with dendrobium phalaenopsis hybrids and have a huge collection of tillandsias. I think sharing plants would be a great way to improve our relationship with the TBG and its orchid collection.

This month we are having our first speaker in the Bob Liddell International Speaker Series. Please try and come to that meeting to support our speaker and the program. We is working on making the meeting more accommodating for our guest speaker, as well as a little more special.

Membership Dues



Education Corner by Marie Hirsch

What Does That Orchid Word Mean?

Monopodial (mon-o-POH-dee-al)

A form of growth in which there is a single vegetative shoot which continues in growth from its terminal bud from season to season, such as in the genus *Vanda*.



Ascocentrum (ass-koh-SEN-trum)

A small genus of compact-growing **monopodial** orchids from Southeast Asia and the Malayan Archipelago, allied to *Vanda*. It was described by Schlechter in 1913, the name referring to the bag-like spur at the base of the lip.

Batemannia (bayt-MAN-nee-a)

A very small genus of **epiphytic** (grows on trees or shrubs for support) orchids from South America, closely related to *Zygopetalum*, *Zygosepalum* and *Promenaea*. It was found in 1843 by Lindley and was named in tribute to **James Bateman**. (Picture thanks to Sunset Valley Orchids.)

Bateman, James (1811-1897)

He was an English orchidist (cultivator of orchids) and an orchidologist (specialist in the branch of botany dealing with orchids) He was noted for his several outstanding books on orchids, particularly the elephantine *Orchids of Mexico and Guatemala* published 1837-1843.
